thing to dread or avoid. In fact, dating should still be an entertaining and beneficial experience in your college years.

"If you go into dating without any clear idea of what you want out of the experience, you're more likely to have a bad experience," Willoughby said. "If you know why you're going on a date, your likelihood of having a good experience drastically improves." Before a date, remind yourself that you are going out with this person because you want to have an enjoyable of couple hours together and get to know them a little more. Try not to fall into the rabbit hole of "what ifs" and stress about what happens after.

If you find that your fight-or-flight response kicks in whenever you think about dating, it's probably time to get back to the basics and discover how you can make dating fun again. A date doesn't need to be lengthy or elaborate to be enjoyable and every date doesn't have to be with someone you're madly in love with. At the very least, dating is a way to get to know others and have a good time while doing it.

## A Healthy Mindset

"The most important thing is to remember that no amount of rejection or frustration in the dating process should diminish your sense of divine worth," Willoughby said. Your dating experiences do not define who you are as an individual, whether you would consider them good or bad. Everyone finds success in dating at different times.

And, as simple and corny as it sounds, if at first you don't succeed, try, try again! "The research suggests that daters who have a resilient mindset, those who continue to put effort into the process, often eventually find a lot of success," Willoughby added. When you go on an awkward date (which is likely to happen a few times in college), take it as another experience under your belt and a funny story to tell!

There is so much to learn from the dating process, and with a healthy mindset, anyone can enjoy the process that will hopefully lead to finding your person.

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om Robinson, advertising professor and host of the "It's Just Dinner" podcast, is on a mission to take the pressure out of dating at BYU and help people have fun with it again. He believes having fun and getting to know people are some of the most important things students can do with their time at BYU. He urges students to look for opportunities to get to know others, rather than being constantly on the prowl for a marriage companion. When talking about the pressure for marriage on campus, he said, "Just stop it, just stop it."
As a bishop of a singles' ward, Robinson noticed a lot of individuals staying home on Friday nights. A lot of the girls in his ward never got asked out on dates. He wanted to change this, so he suggested the boys, and the girls too, find someone and ask to have a meal with them. "Everyone eats, that's the one thing we all have in common," he said

For some, the prospect of finding someone to ask to dinner might seem daunting. The options in one's ward or classes may seem bleak, especially in school programs where the majority of students are one gender. In these situations, Robinson suggested going to the Wilkinson Student Center, or another busy place on campus, finding someone cute and asking them if they'd like to run and grab some lunch right then or dinner later. When asking someone to have a meal, Robinson said a good rule of thumb is that whoever asks pays, regardless of gender.

Robinson said it's not helpful to have a "type" when thinking about who to date. He urged students to go out and get to know lots of different kinds of people to figure out what qualities they like in someone and what values they want them to have.
"You've got to get past first impressions. You've got to get to
know people. You need to investigate to figure out what someone is genuinely like, "said sophomore Harrison Morford.

After going to dinner with someone, there is a chance that they won't want to get together again. They may even choose not to text back, but, according to Robinson, if they do, at least
they've made clear exactly where they stand in terms of wanting to get together again. "Here's the thing about dinner, there are no expectations, so if I never call or text you again, that's OK because it was just dinner. No pressure," Robinson said.

Robinson suggested being as direct as possible with someone
if there is no interest in getting together again; that's much better than leading them on and making them believe they have a chance. "That's going to be less painful. It's going to hurt, but it's only going to hurt for a while," he said.
"The best thing when you're dating is to be direct. Being direct takes some courage, but it's polite. People appreciate directness. I think it's OK to say 'I don't think it's going to be a good fit,'" Morford said.

One of the points of mortality, and a BYU education, is to get to know as many of Heavenly Father's children as possible, explained Robinson. He sees going out to dinner with lots of people is an excellent way to do that.

As highlighted, dating doesn't have to be solely about finding an eternal companion. "This is about having fun. This is about enjoying college. This is about getting out of the apartment. This is about meeting someone. That's what this is about. We need to stop putting all this pressure on ourselves to find a celestial mate, celestial mates come when it's time," Robinson said. # ARE YOU SEEING THESE RELATIONSHIP WARNING SIGNS?

#### Abstract

The questions of how to break up with someone, what red flags to look for and how to figure out what someone needs in a relationship can be constant worries while dating. Professor Alan Hawkins from the School of Family Life suggested not only looking at what a dating partner is doing, but looking at yourself and your actions while considering these issues.


## WARNING SIGNS FOR ENDING A RELATIONSHIP

Professor Alan Hawkins views controlling behavior, jealousy and sexual pushiness as red flags.
"(Controlling behavior) in romantic relationships at first can seem like 'he or she must think I'm really special and is really committed to me,' but behavior that controls the people you see, or other kinds of things, is really inappropriate," said Hawkins. "Jealousy (is also) really not very appropriate. It indicates a kind of insecurity, and potentially a kind of controlling personality. Look out for someone being kind of sexually pushy. This can also indicate (a controlling personality)."

Red flags are things Hawkins said students should look for in a dating partner and in themselves.

Another concern is the inability to keep a commitment. "Making and breaking a commitment over and over is what we call cycling," said Hawkins, "and that is a pretty big red flag in a relationship."

Hawkins believes red flags indicate things just aren't going to work out. If those items come up in a relationship, it's probably time to end it. "You want to (end the relationship) firmly, kindly and as clearly as possible," Hawkins said.

He also mentioned some yellow flags, defined as warning signs that indicate there may be a problem. It may be possible
to work on these together.
"With yellow flags, stop, look and listen," said Hawkins. "See if you can work on those things. See if they are capable of changing."

Mental health is one of those yellow flags, he said. "A lot of people in their twenties struggle with mental health. You want to be aware of this. Ask if this is something they're working on and that they are aware of," he said.

Also, be aware of the dating partner's family. Hawkins described certain familial behaviors that can be yellow flags.
"Is there really heavy enmeshment, meaning is it hard for them to separate themselves as an individual from their family? The family can also put you in a very difficult situation where your partner has to choose between you and them. You need to be aware of this situation. If the family is not supportive of you, you need to be aware of that," he said.

Hawkins strongly suggested taking lots of time in dating and getting to know someone well before jumping into wedding planning. Taking more time allows additional situations for red and yellow flags to pop up, giving more opportunities to assess whether an individual is marriage material.

Master's licensed associate marriage and family therapist Sami Simpson said students should ask themselves what times the emotions that are coming up in a relationship have been felt before. This
practice should be employed especially when a response seems out of proportion to the situation at hand.
"Be very aware of how much your previous experiences carry into dating," said Simpson.

She suggested that the human body will show in its body-language and feelings what the conscious mind does not yet register, and those are important things to pay attention to.

## WHAT YOU NEED IN A RELATIONSHIP

Figuring out what qualities are important in a relationship partner can be difficult. Hawkins said dating itself is a great way to figure out what qualities are important.
"You need to be careful about drawing hard lines, but you get a sense as you're dating people of what you really want. That can be different from what you are attracted to. Research suggests that it's similarity and connection that help you build a strong relationship," he said.
"It is valuable to be clear about what values you really want and need," said Hawkins. He explained that while dating, finding someone who prioritizes the same values is important.

Hawkins highlighted the value of being realistic in requirements for a dating partner.

"Understand that you can't ask for yourself or your partner to already be in the ninety-fifth percentile on something," he said. "Look at their trajectory, not just where they are right now."
"The most important quality to look for in yourself and in a partner is maturity," Hawkins said. "Maturity is not the same as age. People can be pretty mature at 21 , they can be pretty immature at 29 . You have to look deeper than that.
"Someone who is mature can be future-oriented. That doesn't mean they can't be in the moment and appreciate the moment, but they've got a plan. They can see and along with that, they can delay gratification. They can make sacrifices.
"A nother thing you look for is that they can self-regulate. Can they control their emotions to some extent? Can they see how they affect other people? This is a really important skill that we have and a sign of maturity. Being able to make and keep a commitment is a sign of maturity."

Simpson views non-defensiveness as an important quality to look for in a dating partner.
"So, when there is an issue, because there's always an issue, it's not that we don't want any disagreements or arguments or anything to come up," said Simpson. "(When they do) is this person able to manage their emotions enough to be curious about my experience?"

Simpson highlighted the importance of being interested and aware of the emotions of oneself and the other person in a relationship.

An additional resource can be the teachings of Church leaders. "I can confidently recommend that we should listen to the wise counsel of Church leaders on
these topics. Maybe ask
some married people you really trust what they would look for in a partner," said Hawkins.

One of the most important pieces of advice Hawkins gave is the ability to think through dating and marriage decisions.
"The more you can engage your brain, the better. It is a wise thing to listen to other people's opinions about who you are dating," said Hawkins. "They may not be right, but you should certainly be listening to them. They can sometimes see things that you miss, or maybe they know someone else who has dated (the person) you are seeing. Allow some time for those things to come out. People can be very wrong about other people, but take people's advice and put your antenna up."
